You belong to the tribe of the Loango (Gabon, Africa) -They say: „Welcome“ by:	Loango tribe, Gabon Hands clapping for minutes
You belong to the tribe of the Germans (Central Europe) -They say: „Welcome“ by:	German tribe, Central Europe Shake hands
You belong to the tribe of the Japanese (Central Island) -They say: „Welcome“ by:	Tribe of the Japanese "Watashi no meishi desu" – which means: This is my business card
You belong to the tribe of the English (Central Islands) -They say: „Welcome“ by:	Tribe of the English Waving hands, Nodding the head
You belong to the tribe of the French (Central Brittany, Europe) -They say: „Welcome“ by:	Tribe of the French (Central Brittany, Europe) Three kisses on cheeks right and left (starting with right cheek)
You belong to the tribe of the Northern Inuit, Alaska -They say: „Welcome“ by:	Tribe of the Northern Inuit, Alaska Rub the others nose
You belong to the tribe of the Massai (Kenia, Central Africa)	Tribe of the Massai (Kenia, Central Africa) Clap hands, shake hands
